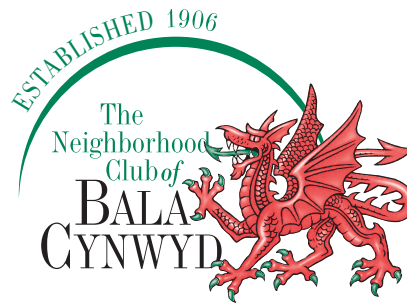

Neighbors and friends,

I am writing to wish you the best in the New Year and to ask you to support your local civic association — The Neighborhood Club of Bala Cynwyd. For more than 100 years, The Neighborhood Club has worked hard to keep the quality of life in our community high. We want you to join so that we can continue our work!

- Build community through special events such as the Independence Day Celebration
- Address public school issues in order to provide the best education for our children
- Take an active role in support of open space and historic preservation
- Advocate for the R-6 train and other public transportation
- Work to maintain the residential character of our community while monitoring zoning and land use matters throughout Bala Cynwyd, including those involving City Avenue, Belmont Avenue, Rock Hill Road, Bala Avenue, Old Lancaster Avenue, and the Schuylkill riverfront

Most recently, in response to an initiative taken by the City Avenue Special Services District, the Township plans to introduce zoning ordinance amendments as part of a rezoning of the City Avenue corridor. The purpose of the rezoning would be to establish standards which would encourage mixed-use development intended to be more appropriate than the type of development which could occur under the current zoning standards. Rezoning would involve changes in use regulations, dimensional standards, parking and loading requirements, density regulations, development design standards, and signage regulations. Our zoning subcommittee, led by Vice President John Grugan, has begun to work closely with Commissioners Reed and Manos to make sure that the amendment process has the additional community input and direction necessary to protect the character of Bala Cynwyd while improving the quality of future development on the City Avenue corridor. In addition, four Neighborhood Club directors — David Haas, Mark Kocent, Roger Moog, and Merle Zucker — have been appointed by the Township to serve on the City Avenue Transportation Services Area Advisory Committee (TSAAC). The creation of TSAAC is the first step in proposing and establishing a large-scale Transportation Service Area study in order to consider the impact of development on traffic.
